INTERNATIONAL UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS NURSING REQUIREMENTS

Nursing Program Applicants: The program has limited enrollment and the best qualified applicants will be considered. Students admitted to the program generally exceed minimum requirements. Applicants must apply early to have a completed file for the **February 1st deadline for the Nursing Admissions Committee**. Applicants approved for admission to the Nursing Program will begin their studies in August.

Deadline for Non-US Transcripts for Nursing Applicants: Transcripts for Non-US secondary school and post secondary school coursework must be official and must be received by December 1st - <u>two months prior to the Nursing Committee deadline</u> in order to have sufficient time for evaluation.

The following requirements must be met for admission to Purdue University Calumet.

- 2. You must be a graduate of an accredited secondary school and prove secondary school graduation by submitting official academic transcripts, graduation certificates, and if appropriate true and attested English translations (sent directly from your issuing institution).
- 3. You must meet the Academic Standards for admission set by Purdue University Calumet's Academic Departments.
- 4. For admission into a degree seeking major, you **must prove proficiency in the English Language** by achieving one of the following and submitting an official test score report or transcript:
 - a. A **TOEFL** (Test of English as a Foreign Language) score of 550, paper and pencil test, or 79, internet Based TOEFL (iBT).
 - b. A grade of at least a B in English at the ordinary level of **G.C.E.** (General Certificate of Education) or **G.C.S.E.** (General Certificate of Secondary Education).
 - c. A Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) verbal score of 480 or greater.
 - d. Transferable credit from an accredited US institution of higher education equivalent to Purdue University Calumet's ENGL 104, English Composition course. English 104 equivalents are not guaranteed and are subject to change at any time through the discretion of the Department of English & Philosophy.
 - e. An IELTS (International English Language Testing System) Score of 6.5.

Note: If you did not take or have low English proficiency scores for entry into a degree seeking major, you may still be eligible for admission into Purdue University Calumet's English Language Program (ELP). If you are interested in ELP, please mark English Training on the application and English proficiency scores will not be required for admission. All other admission requirements remain the same.

5. If you have attended any other college or university and plan to transfer credit hours to Purdue University Calumet as an undergraduate student, you must complete the Transfer Credit Documentation Sheet (available at www.calumet.purdue.edu/admissions/tcds.pdf), submit a \$30.00 (US) transfer credit evaluation fee, official academic transcripts from an accredited college or university and if appropriate true and attested English translations.
