



All international students can remain in the UK for two years after graduation using the Post Study Work Visa. The visa grants you working rights in the UK, and you do not need to be sponsored by your employer.

To transfer to Bristol, you must meet our academic and English language requirements.

Academic

- You must achieve a **75% grade average**
- You must study the following optional units:
 - o Semi-Conductor Physics and Devices
 - o MATLAB Language and Applications
 - o Data Structures

English language

- You must achieve the requirements of **Profile E:**
- 6.5 overall, minimum 6.0 in all bands
- We also accept other qualifications and tests, including TOEFL

$\dot{\Box}$ You do not need to have met these requirements when you apply.

You will need to provide evidence that you have reached the required English language level, and our academic requirements, when you apply for your UK visa. You will normally apply for your visa in July.

If you are struggling to meet our English language requirements you can complete our Pre-Sessional Programme. This allows students to spend their summer improving their English language and academic skills before starting their degree at Bristol.

You will need to accept your offer within two weeks. Your place is held until you provide your qualifications later in the summer.



We want to welcome the brightest minds to our campus and offer several scholarships to support our students.

All students who apply through this partnership will receive an exclusive scholarship. The UOB-NUAA Strategic Partner Scholarship will reduce your tuition fee by 15%.

You do not need to apply for the scholarship, it will be automatically applied when you apply. However if you apply using an agent, you won't be eligible for a scholarship.

Your tuition fee, including the above scholarship, will be £22,015 for the 2022/23 academic year. Tuition fees will rise by a small amount each year to account for inflation. You should budget for an annual increase of 5%.

Other scholarships

Our Think Big Scholarship Programme offers a range of scholarships, exclusive to international students, that can help fund your tuition fees. Applications close on 30 March 2022.

Apply for a scholarship online

You can only receive one scholarship from Bristol. If you are shortlisted for multiple scholarships from Bristol, you will automatically receive the higher amount.

Cost of living

Your other living expenses will depend on your way of life. The cost of living in Bristol is around 25% cheaper than London. As a guide, most students spend in the region of £9,000 to £15,000 a year on living expenses, including accommodation, although you may spend more depending on your housing choices and lifestyle.

Bristol is home to many colourful neighbourhoods. **Cliftonwood Road** features many Victorian terraced houses, painted in bright colours.


